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1. Approve March club meeting minutes (sent via email - available on website)

Minutes approved. Correction to mayhem and add Kristin Hendricks attendance for Shock.

2. President's Report - Marten Mills

- Ashley from PCA presented on programs available. Focus on athletes as primary touchpoint, workshops for kids, segregated by age groups. Triple impact for older kids, go through series of how they can be better teammates, lead by example, etc. Junior triple impact competition, they do real life type practices in addition to curriculum. Tools to teach kids (and coaches) how to "shake it off." Move on from mistakes and use it as a learning experience. They also have parent workshops 30-60 minutes in duration, equip them with tools to handle conversations with kids about the game from a psychology background.
- Different perspective where parents can learn from kids as they go through the program. Empowering kids to have tools to work through this "win at all cost mentality".
- Ashley can connect us with others in the area that have implemented this type of program so that we understand what worked well, what could be improved, how do they handle follow up after training. PCA publishes newsletters that will address refreshers after the training.
- Triple impact 10-12 and above, one day session in a workshop setting, some breakout sessions and activities. Ranges from 1-2 hours
- Junior Impact – under 10, held on the field,
- Need to figure out the approach that we would take to implement this. How do we determine who to roll this out to? If we have 3 sessions, we could hit 260-300 kids. Perhaps different approach for the parent sessions – target to younger teams when they come on board. Questions about requiring coaches to go through the training.
- About \$3200 for 3 sessions, this would come out of club budget because we are working to improve club culture and environment. We will look at budget and determine if we add a small amount to player fee (for example, \$5 additional). **Managers in attendance are all in favor of moving forward with mapping this out. Marten will follow up.**

3. Registrar Report - (Marten for Christian Bjoernson)

- Christian is looking to transition away from registrar role, his son is playing with Juventus. If anyone is interested in stepping in to take over this role, please let us know.

4. Treasurer Report (Scott)

- Scott and Brad still working to transition treasurer information in the next 2 weeks, and will also get scholarship checks out in that time period

5. Fields (Jon Burt)

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- Highlands on Monday is severely impacted now that baseball has started. Little league has field until 7:20, if they are playing, we have to wait.
 - Jon is working on requests for field changes and he will get those taken care of in the next couple of days. We're at capacity in San Carlos for fields. This is a perfect time to write to city council about impact of field space. Amy, Fred, Marten and Jon are meeting in the next few weeks to talk about this.
 - Restriction at Highlands is lifted as far as what time games can start and what time people can be on the field
6. Referee Report (Marten for Rich Godwin)
- Highlands needs lining. Will line it this week, rain has been a problem.
 - Rich will do referee appreciation day in the spring
 - Managers send out note to teams to get adult and youth refs to sign up
 - Make sure you are paying the proper amount for ref fees. Center ref gets \$10 more than number of minutes played, ARs get amount equal to number of refs

- Contract with Nike has been signed. Karen will get the ball rolling on the uniform bank.
 - My Uniform will be set up by beginning of June so that they can be ordered and picked up by end of June.
 - No mixing Nike and Adidas uniforms.
